One family commented 'disagree' to a number of questions, as can be seen above, giving the following explanation:

So far A is showing towards all 4 parents that he is not keen on nursery when entering, when first getting to nursery when he first started he used to get so excited, after a week he now screams as turning into the gates. Communication I think is awful. I am not made aware daily what he is up to when at nursery and also not told what he had to snack or how his nappies were when changed unless I ask. Home learning does not work, nursery work is for at nursery, home work should not be done, being at home is a time to relax away from nursery. As it is still early days that A has been at nursery I cannot make the decision if I would recommend this nursery.

It is quite common that children may initially be excited to begin nursery and then become reluctant after a week or so. Please be assured that staff take time to help children to settle at the start of a session and they are usually off playing within a couple of minutes. If you are concerned about how your child is settling please speak with a member of room staff.

Staffs priority during collection is to ensure children are handed over to parents/carers safely. They are always available for a brief conversation with parents/carers who are collecting their children on time at the end of the session. Information about snack is available to view on the parent notice board which is updated weekly. If you need a more detailed conversation then we ask that parents/carers make an appointment to speak with a member of staff. Between 11.30 and 12.30 staff tidy rooms for the next session, supervise lunch club and have their own lunch. From 3.30 staff need to set up for the next day, attend the daily meeting to review learning and progress, complete Tapestry posts and lots more.

There is lots of research highlighting the benefits of home learning and how this prepares children for the next stage of their education and beyond. We understand that parents/carers may not choose to engage in all the home learning shared by staff. Children also learn lots from other experiences they have with family at home which is why we encourage you to share these activities with us on Tapestry.

The only other 'disagree' comment was:

I complete appreciate how busy you all are and this is not meant to be a criticism it's more feedback/observation- because of my personal situation I would appreciate more updates via tapestry to know what H has been doing /what he's doing well on/how I can help at home. Most of the home activities H is not interested in, that's more down to his interests than me having any issue with what you do.

Please see the comments below regarding staff Tapestry posts. Staff are always available for a brief chat at drop off or collection, please speak with staff to make an appointment if you feel a longer conversation would be helpful.

Can you give an example of something Sandy Lane Nursery and Forest School has done which has made a positive difference to your child AND/OR you as a family e.g. supporting with things like toilet training, managing behavior, speech and language or other health needs, families wellbeing during times of stress, building a sense of community and friendship with other parents/carers – parent groups, volunteering, fundraising. How has your attendance at our workshops benefitted you and your child?

- speech and language we are impressed that staff is able to learn Polish at home to support our child with English (e.g., numbers to encourage him to count in English). It means that they are looking for different ways to develop children and they look after them in a high standard.
- home learning activities, activity packs, etc give us a lot of new ideas to develop our child.
- our child is more and more independent (e.g, preparing meals, wearing clothes/shoes, taking them off, etc)
- cooking ideas which are shared by other teachers on tapestry which encourage us to try them and develop our child's cooking skills.
- we really enjoy the workshops which we attended. We use most of the ideas shown during the workshops at home. Some of the techniques were known by us but there were a lot of new once, too. It is helpful that teachers shared their experience during the workshops and that there was an opportunity to share our experience as parents, too.

How has Tapestry helped with sharing information about your child's learning and ideas home learning? Some things are shared on tapestry as a class, there is nothing specifically to your child's progress. Over the course of the term staff share a range of Tapestry posts, some of which are linked to learning and development. At the end of the term staff post a summary of children's progress sharing next steps for learning and ideas that will support this continued development at home. In this post staff offer parents/carers, who may wish to, the opportunity to make an appointment to discuss things further. Parent/carer Tapestry posts are also important to show things children do at home that staff may not see in the classroom. Parents/carers are welcome to make an appointment to speak with their child's key worker at any time to discuss their child's progress.

It certainly has and is easy to access

It makes communication swift and so that home and nursery can work closely on next steps. We really enjoy watching the key texts videos too.

Tapestry is a great way to provide updates and we love being able to see what activities have been done.

We check it regularly and do home learning activities, read memos and all observations. We also upload photos and videos of home learning activities, activity packs, etc.

Each week's home learning is fun and interesting, we don't have much time to always do them however they're good ideas. T learning is progressing well and we receive regular updates via tapestry and in person.

At the end of each term staff post a short summary of children's learning and progress. This also shared next steps for learning with ideas of how parents/carers can support at home. At this time parents/carers are invited to make an appointment to meet with their child's key worker should they with too. Should you wish to discuss a child's progress or any other issue at any time you are very welcome to make an appointment to speak to their key worker.
