(b) I don't feel like I'm told enough about what xxx has done or learnt</p> <p>Staff post a range of photos showing activities that have been offered to all children in their rooms and there are regular updates on our school Facebook. More details information on the progress of individual children is gathered during the child's termly VIP week. During this week staff closely observe VIP children, posting these observations to parents and show the learning that has taken place. At the end of the child's VIP week staff post a short report on Tapestry indicating whether the child is working at the level expected for their age as well as suggestions of activities to try at home to support the child's continued development. In addition to the formal invitation to speak with your child's keyworker at the end of their VIP week, if parents have any questions regarding their child's learning and development staff are always available. I understand that parents may not want to have conversations at drop off and collection in the same way that they did when we were able to invite parents into nursery. I am very much hoping that we will be able to open our doors to parents in the not too distant future but in the meantime, if you have any questions or want to share any information please speak to your child's key worker or ring the office to make an appointment.</p> <p>(c) Homework more for parents than the kids (d) Home learning - only disagree due to not being able to get xxx to focus enough to complete them (e) He is not interested in doing the home learning, tried to do it with him but he isn't interested.</p> <p>Due to Covid 19 most of the home learning has been shared via Tapestry as we have been unable to pass items physically between home and nursery. This has meant that parents have needed to be involved in explaining and working with their child at home on the activities. These have been things like sharing stories, looking for signs of the seasons, planting seeds, counting and sorting and yoga activities. We hoped that parents would enjoy spending time together with their child to complete the activities and we have been grateful for parents sharing photos of their home learning with us on Tapestry. More recently we have been able to send home the learning bags which have a literacy or maths focus. We do appreciate that there may be times when a child may not be interested in a certain home learning activity. As partners in your child's learning journey comments on how your child has engaged in home learning give staff more information to assess your child's development. If you feel that your child is struggling to concentrate or engage in the home learning please speak to their key worker who will be able to help.</p>

19	<p>What could we change of make better</p> <p>(a) Nothing as yet</p> <p>(b) More observations/progress reports</p> <p>(c) Nothing at all</p> <p>(d) Nothing</p> <p>(e) Everything is great</p> <p>(f) I'm happy with the nursery the way it is</p> <p>(g) I think its the staff that make my child have a great experience. Nic, Bev and Saadet are great with him and all the rainbow room staff put so much effort in to ensuring the children enjoy their time at nursery.</p> <p>(h) Cooking activities on the table not on the floor. <i>Our 'carpet cookery' (named by the children) are really popular and take place as part of family group time. We are not able to fit a family group around a table and enable all children to see and take part fully so arrange the session in this way. To ensure good hygiene the floor is cleaned prior to the session and then covered with dedicated plastic cloths.</i></p> <p>(i) I'm happy with the nursery and staff, although it would be lovely to have a booklet with pictures of the staff with names and a bit about them, ie, role, likes etc. Just to get to know the new staff more. As I understand covid and time make it that bit harder. <i>In addition to door step visits by a member of the room staff, information about room staff and photos are shared with parents via Tapestry as the children start. We can certainly offer parents a paper copy of this information if they prefer.</i></p> <p>(j) Absolutely nothing, you go above and beyond</p> <p>(k) <i>More videos and photos of his classes adventures. But that's just because I'm nosey and wish I could come in to nursery and watch him playing and interacting. I love watching the video clips too. We hope that once COVID restrictions relax we will be able to invite parents into nursery to share in the fun too 😊</i></p> <p>(l) The only issue I have is loss of clothing or the. Amount of clothing I take in for my daughter to rather come out in items that are not hers or the loss of the clothes.</p> <p>(m) I just would like Evie to come home in her own clothing, as lots of clothing has been given in for her and we don't get them back. She comes home in different things.</p>
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Lost or mixed up clothing has been an issue for a couple of parents. Each child has a draw string bag on their peg with their spare clothes in. As parents aren't able to come into nursery to refill these it's now done by staff. If staff are receiving a few sets of spare clothes for different children at the same time, this may be where the mix ups are occurring. We can ensure that clothing bags are labelled with the child's name on receipt which should help. It would also help us greatly if all parents could ensure that their child's clothes were labelled. As you can imagine we have lots of school sweatshirts, unicorn leggings etc in the same size which can make things difficult. If you have any other suggestions please let your child's key worker know.

- (n) Some communication at pickup or a weekly update on things like interaction and progress. I don't really have an idea how she is when she's there so that would be good to know. Although there are pictures it doesn't really show how they behave and interact with other children and the staff.
- (o) More general information about how they are doing, friendship groups, favourite activities within nursery
- (p) Telling parents about what their child has done or learnt and what they are improving on and not improving on.
- (q) I think possibly a parents type evening/ phone call to discuss progress would be good.

Staff share children's progress, including what they have learnt and their next steps during the child's VIP week. At this time parents are invited to meet with staff should they wish. In addition staff regularly post photos of the things children have been enjoying during the week. We try to encourage parents to log into Tapestry at least weekly on 'Tapestry Tuesday'. Staff are always available to have a quick catch up with parents at drop of or collection time. If your child has a personal plan then their progress is also discussed with you at the time of the plan review. We understand that, due to COVID restrictions and parents having to stay outside the building, you may want more than a quick conversation in the entrance. If you would like a longer conversation please speak with your child's key worker or ring the office and we can arrange for an appointment for a meeting or telephone conversation.

- (r) I don't think I would change anything, I can't wait for Alfie's brother to start in January as I know he will be well looked after

- (u) Go to Forest School more often, the kids love that place. Forest School is certainly very popular and currently all children get to attend one session a week. As COVID restrictions relax we can consider mixing bubbles, with inclusive sessions, which would enable children to visit more frequently.
- (v) Nothing, really do a great job
- (w) Everything is brilliant what the nursery are doing at this moment in time.
- (x) To make sure she has water proofs on if playing with water as some times come home wet. Staff do always try to ensure children are wearing waterproofs but sometimes children are so keen to play that they are too quick for us !! We have plenty of spare clothes in nursery and I will remind staff to ensure children are changed.
- (y) Once restrictions lift it would be nice to be able to see what the children get up to.
- (z) When covid restrictions remove - more parent activities to come into the nursery.

We usually have a range of activities we regularly share with parents, including forest school sessions, stay and play sessions, exploratory cookery, gardening, workshops and much more. We have missed not having the opportunity to invite parents in to share the fun of nursery and can't wait until we are able to offer these again 😊

- (ee) The only thing I don't like so much is the change to open snack, my daughter needs strong encouragement to have at least a drink when she is busy or playing, she would much

rather carry on playing so she doesn't miss out. When it is pick up time, she can be really thirsty, hungry and grouchy which was never an issue with set snack time.

We were a little puzzled by this comment but haven't been able to find out any more information from the parent as it was sent in anonymously. Children in garden room have taken part in what we call 'rolling snack', accessing snack when they are ready for a number of years. In the Autumn term they did have group snack time as numbers of children were lower and each family group took turns at the snack table. As numbers have increased we could no longer accommodate everyone around the snack table at one time, we introduced 'rolling snack'. This process has been followed for a number of years and staff are on hand to support any children who are new to the room to access a healthy snack. There is also a system in place which allows staff to identify which children haven't accessed snack during the session. Within 30 minutes of the snack area being 'closed' staff will invite these children to have a drink and some snack. Children in sunshine and rainbow rooms do have a group snack as numbers of children in each of these rooms mean this is able to take place. We would welcome the opportunity to speak to this parent so we are able to reassure them about their child's snack time experience and work together to resolve the issue raised.

(kk) Bake more 😊. In garden room baking is done in family group time and we do have some exploratory cookery sessions as part of free play for children who want to take part. Children in rainbow and sunshine rooms also have regular opportunities for baking and exploratory cookery activities. There are so many exciting activities for children to choose in nursery it's difficult to find time to fit everything in 😊
