My child does not have much understanding of the home tasks given (Rainbow Room parent) We are currently developing home activities for children in Rainbow which we hope will be more appropriate to their needs

Attend more to self-care needs (Garden Room parent)

For children in Garden Room we support them to become increasingly independent, like going to the toilet, putting on and taking off their own coats and shoes. We also have lots of tissue boxes around so that they can blow their own noses. Of course we give that little bit extra support to any child who needs it whilst at the same time encouraging them to have a go.

To learn even more (Garden Room parent)

Play is the vehicle for young children's learning and that is how we plan for your child's learning. You will be surprised by all of the things your child is learning all of the time! In family groups we formally plan for learning to match your child's needs. This might involve counting, recognising numbers and our own names from name cards and those of our friends. Even tidying up is a chance for more learning: counting the right amount of pencils/scissors to go in the right labelled container; a felt tip to have on the correct coloured lid; books being put the right way up; wooden blocks being matched to the right shape on the cupboard. We also want your child to have time to make friends, to explore and learn in the environment on their own or with friends and not always with an adult. Any child who looks a little 'lost' is quickly scooped up by and adult and invited into their play.

Reminders everyday regarding weekly activities for busy parents (Garden Room parent)			
We do include any significant activities on the newsletter which goes out half-termly and is displayed			
on the door. We put any important events which may be happening the following day/week on our			
signing-in sheets and onto Tapestry. We are hoping to have a facility put onto our website for parents			
too. If you have any other ideas of how we could inform you please let us know.			
Printed newsletters (Garden Room parent)			
We are trying to cut back on the amount of paper we use, not only for the environment but also so that			
we can redirect money spent on paper, ink and the photocopier to other things for the children.			
Therefore we put the newsletter on Tapestry and on the website. However, we do understand that			
some parents prefer a paper copy and for that reason we always print off a handful which are kept on			
the noticeboard as you come in and we also display a copy on the door.			
Have more staff (Garden Room)			
We are actually very well staffed. By law we should have 1 adult to every 13 children but currently we			
have 1 adult to every 8 children. We often have students in too so that's even more adult attention for			
children! On top of that every room has a teacher assigned to it and all of our teaching assistants are			
qualified to at least level 3 (A level) and some have degrees like a teacher would have. Children in			
private nurseries are not required to have such highly qualified staff so Sandy Lane Nursery and			
Forest School is quite special!
