- 4) At handover I often don't get informed about T's day, I understand that it is a busy time for the teachers, but I would just like to know even a little bit about T's day, what he's been doing etc. (please see what could we change or better for a response)

1) Helped engaging with H

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- 2) K wouldn't speak or interact with other children and now he does and tells me who his best friends are.
- 3) Helped increase my sons tolerance of new textures
- 4) Shown understanding and empathy for C's attachment difficulties
- 4) Helped and supported towards future education
- 5) So welcoming and caring!
- 6) Specifically positive food experiences at snack time meant B chose to lick a cracker for the first time. Big step for her as she has a significant oral aversion and is fully peg fed."

20 What could we change or make better?

Lots of parents said 'Nothing' in addition to the other comments below:

Nothing needs changing everything you do is 100%

I can't think of anything!

To be honest I think everything is perfect and no changes need to be done!

Nothing I always say this but.. why mess with something that's perfect.

You are brilliant

This is a great school

We think you all do great job, nothing has to be change.

Honestly nothing in my opinion.

We also had the following suggestions:

Expand provision at Sandy Lane to offer 30 hours to Rainbow room children. It's an amazing provision! We would certainly love to be able to offer extended hours in Rainbow Room but simply don't have the pupil places available at present. Rainbow Room is full each year meaning that we can support lots of children with SEND and their families, however this means that we don't have the space to offer any additional paid for hours for children attending. We do have a limited number of breakfast club, after nursery and 30 hours places available for all 3 and 4 year olds which are taken in our mainstream Garden Room.

Parking

Possibly monitor the use of disabled parking bays. Although it may be difficult. As a parent of a SEN child with a blue badge it is difficult to use the disabled bays in the car park due to them being used by cars without a blue badge displayed

We are aware that during busy periods it can be difficult to find a parking space, especially a blue badge space, due to this being a busy multi-use site. Unfortunately we aren't able to extend the car park so the staggered times for drop off and collection with the onsite PVI was established to try to reduce the number of families using the car park at any one time. Users from the different buildings on site are required to display a pass if they are staying longer than drop off or collection with the aim of ensuring only campus users are parking here and that they are parked appropriately. We also regularly patrol the car park to try to ensure people are parked correctly. To help further I have sent out reminders to our parents/carers and other campus users to try to alleviate this issue.

What the next focus is on L education on a more frequent basis.

Formal assessments shared that say where children need more support in but this isn't something necessarily in such need

At the end of each term staff post on Tapestry children's 'next steps for learning' which provide parents/carers with ideas with activities to support children's progress and development. We ask parents/carers to add Tapestry posts of their child working on these 'next steps' at home. That way staff can celebrate children's achievements and provide further guidance on how to continue to support learning once these have been met. Staff are always available at the beginning and end of each session if parents/carers want any further advice so please don't feel the need to wait until the end of the term. For those preferring a more detailed discussion, staff are always happy to arrange an appointment to meet with you. Better variety with the weekly books that come home. Sensory, textured or noisy books would be better. We've had 'pop up' books and sign language books sent home in his red bag which aren't able to keep him engaged.

One of our school improvement priorities this year is early reading and developing children's love of books. We have recently reviewed the books offered in our Rainbow Room lending library and invested in a range of sensory books. These have just been delivered and we hope children will enjoy sharing them with parents/carers at home. Happy Reading ©

I would suggest maybe adding something to entertain the children for when they get there before the doors open. We have to time everything down to the last minute because A doesn't want to wait to go in. Maybe some playground equipment.

Our staggered opening times enable parents/carers to arrive in nursery within a 10 minute window. The school operates on a tight budget and funds aren't available to provide and maintain playground equipment at the front of the site. Installing such would also have implications for health and safety monitoring as we are part of a busy campus site. There are extensive grounds which would provide the opportunity for children to play and be physically active, under parent/carer supervison, before the school opens. Staff are always available to discuss any specific difficulties with individual parents/carers to help resolve any issues

The only thing that bothers me is that it is very cold in kindergarten and my child gets sick because of it, and that if there is a cold wind outside, small children move out there and then there are big health problems. I wish this was changed

One of the doors in garden room is open throughout the session to enable children to have free access to the outdoors. At times when it is cold and children choose to learn outdoors, staff ensure they are suitably dressed and limit outdoor time to 30 minutes before children return indoors to 'warm up' before having the option to return outside. During winter children are also offered a warm drink at snack time. We encourage parents to dress children in layers during the colder months, rather than one thicker jumper for example, with warm coats, a hat and gloves as this helps to keep them warm. When children start any nursery and are mixing with other children they often get viruses and research suggests good ventilation and playing in fresh air can help to boost children's immune systems helping them to fight off infections and build up their resilience. Staff are always available to discuss specific issues regarding children's health either informally at drop off/collection or by making an appointment for a more formal meeting.

It will be an idea to make a meeting between older people (like people from homecare) and the children. I saw a community cafe in front of St. Stephen Church. But I think because of Covid is not possible at the moment.

I don't know if you have in the curriculum but also adding a little bit of information about traffic rules for pedestrians to tell the kids. We do this when we are in the streets. Knowing what red, amber and green lights mean. Also bringing a police officer, a firefighter at the nursery will be a nice experience.

Our school has links with the elderly through Westvale Care Home where we make regular visits to share songs, stories and activities. Unfortunately we haven't been able to visit due to COVID but look forward to taking the children as soon as we are able. In addition to teaching children about road safety through their play and on our community walks we have a special 'safety week' each year which supports this along with a range of visitors including those mentioned.

Maybe have the home learning bags for a little bit longer, D loves playing the games and likes to share them with the family but sometimes finds it hard to be able to play with everybody before it's time to take them back

We're really pleased to hear that D likes to get all the family involved in her home learning. We have a limited number of bags which are rotated to all the groups of children in garden room but if you speak to a staff member they would be happy for you to keep your bag a little longer. We can also look to increase the number of bags we have to enable more families to do this in the future.

The amount paid for the 30 hours for the child. It seems dear.

We found this comment a little confusing as families eligible for 30 hours free childcare are not asked to pay any additional fees. Our only charges are for breakfast and after school sessions for these parents if they want to take up this offer. Breakfast club, for example, is charged at £3 and includes a light breakfast. When available, parents not eligible for 30 hours can choose to purchase additional hours at a charge of £5 per hour. These fees are actually very competitive especially considering the qualifications of our staff. Unlike most private and voluntary providers all our rooms are overseen by a qualified teacher and many of our staff are qualified to degree level. The fees charged to parents/carers don't fully cover our costs but are a contribution towards this.

I personally don't think that there is much to improve, I'd appreciate if staff would tell me at handover a little more but it isn't majorly important because I see most things on tapestry

The end of the session is always busy but staff always make time for a brief chat with parents and carers. As suggested, Tapestry posts are a good way to find out a little more about the fun and learning children have engaged in as well as an opportunity to talk with your child about their day. If there are any specific things you want to know please just ask.

I would love to be able to sit in on one of his sessions and observe exactly what he does etc in his standing frame, watching how he interacts in activities

Please have a chat with staff in your child's classroom and they will be happy to share more videos and photographs of your son engaging in nursery activities with you via Tapestry. These will just be 'snapshots' as we will not, unfortunately, have the time to add a written update to them all as well. You are also more than welcome to stay for a little longer when you drop him off and we can let you see him in his standing frame. We don't usually have stay and play sessions in Rainbow Room as we have found, in the past when have tried this, that children have not coped well with their parent staying as they are used to them saying goodbye and leaving them. The change in routine has then caused them to be quite unsettled.
